## **NWMO - Business Expense Standard (Modified Extract for Program Participants)**

This Meals, Travel, Hospitality and Business Expense standard is to cover the normal incurrence of expenses while travelling and conducting business as part of NWMO programs. The rules stated in this standard are expected to be followed unless explicit approval of the NWMO is obtained. The overall principle is that individuals should not be out of pocket when travelling as part of participation in NWMO programs as long as the expense is reasonable and supportable.

These guidelines will determine reasonability and acceptability.

- Ensure that adequate descriptions of the nature of all expense items are recorded.
- A Missing Receipt Form must be completed for each missing or lost receipt in order to support the expense claim.
- The participant will be responsible for demonstrating that expenses are strictly NWMO program related and are not personal in nature.
- The participant will be required to repay any business expense claim if expenses are subsequently found to be not in compliance with the requirements of this document.

### **Evidence Requirements**

All expenses require receipts except for mileage claims and certain public transportation claims where receipts are not readily available. A "Missing Receipt" form is to be used if receipt is lost.

### **Travel**

The following principles apply to travel related expenses:

- Air/Rail/Road Transportation
- Travel must be arranged in advance and be booked by fixed dates. The standard is economy class. Exceptions to economy class in Canada and the U.S. will only be granted for health reasons
- For rail transport, coach class travel should be used in all circumstances.
- Use of the most economical form of road transportation is the general guideline. Use of public transport is advised for short distance travel where appropriate giving consideration to effective use of time.
- Flight passes will only be used where economic advantage can be demonstrated.

### **Hotel**

- Judgment to be used to ensure selected accommodation is conveniently located, safe and takes into account the specific NWMO program in which the participant is engaged.
- Planned accommodations in a hotel rated higher than 4-star requires pre-approval of the NWMO.
- The use of Suites, concierge service, and executive floors is not allowed.

### **Rental Car**

- Mid-size vehicle is the standard. Exceptions permitted where conditions justify.
- If your mileage claim is expected to be in excess of 175 km per day, consideration should be given to renting a vehicle if practical or feasible.

**Meals Expenses**

The daily meal limit is \$60 per day for meals while travelling. Claimants to use best judgment in the circumstances and provide explanation for costs in excess of the guideline.

**Personal Automobile Mileage**

- Reimbursement for business kilometers is as follows:

\$0.40 up to 4,000 KM's

\$0.35 for KM's 4,001 to 10,700

\$0.29 for KM's 10,701 to 24,000

\$0.24 for KM's in excess of 24,000

**Incidentals**

Actual reasonable expenditures with receipts are reimbursable. In-room services (e.g. movies, mini-bar, etc.), and alcoholic beverages are not allowable expenses.

**Miscellaneous**

• Ground transportation, parking, gratuities, telephone calls (personal) and other NWMO program related travel expenses, at lowest reasonable costs in the circumstances, shall be reimbursable.

**Auditing Requirements**

All expense claims for travel and other business expenses are subject to review or audit. At any time, reimbursed expenses found to have been unreasonable and/or without receipts could be disallowed.

Good morning Vince,

Thanks for submitting the receipts for expenses incurred during Pinehouse' Learn More visit to Toronto.

I have reviewed the receipts, but in advance of submitting to Finance for reimbursement, I have a couple of questions about two of the expenditures. Your travel (\$384.00), hotel (\$852.65) and meals (347.81) expenses are all acceptable.

The receipts in question are for transportation to the Airport (\$400) and Incidentals (\$48).

The NWMO would be pleased to reimburse Pinehouse for the cost of a trip to the Airport from what would be the equivalent cost from your hotel, the Delta Chelsea. As a reference figure, the flat fee for the taxi from the Airport to the Delta Chelsea was \$72.

Regarding the incidentals cost, \$36 of the \$48 claimed is food related and would therefore be covered under the NWMO's business expense standard. The remaining \$12 however is an incidental cost which is not covered in the NWMO's business expense standard. That said, the \$36 receipt submitted for onboard meals is dated August 4<sup>th</sup> (outside the date of travel) and can therefore not be reimbursed.

I am writing in response to the email regarding a request for funds received from Vince Natomagan on behalf of Kineepik Métis Local on November 10, 2010.

We appreciate you keeping us informed on developments in your area and opportunities where we can help as your community learns about Adaptive Phased Management and the interest of Kineepik Métis Local and the Northern Village of Pinehouse in this national infrastructure project. We are sensitive to the fact that your community is subject to pressures, internal and external, that have arisen as a result of your request to learn more and to have a Step 2 Initial Screening conducted.

It is clear that the community of Pinehouse has a committed and forward-thinking leadership team and that an informed public will provide the base of support that the leadership will need in making decisions regarding going forward with this project once the Initial Screening is completed.

We have considered your request and wish to suggest the following components of the Learn More program be combined with support for a dedicated resource person to support Mayor and Council as needed and begin engaging people in your community.

### **EARLY SUPPORT TO COMMUNITIES INVOLVED IN STEP 2 OF THE SITE SELECTION PROCESS – LEARN MORE**

**Purpose:**

To provide support to potential host communities in the early stages of the Site Selection Process following a request to Learn More and a Step 2 Initial Screening.

- Support is available for the purposes of providing information to community members and initiating contact with surrounding communities, as may be necessary, and to begin the development of the elements for continued involvement, through a Step 3 Memorandum of Understanding, in the site selection process following completion of the Initial Screening.
- Support is available to help engage community members (as described in the Learn More program), travel expenses to visit neighbouring communities, and development of initial community considerations for a Memorandum of Understanding in Step 3 (should this step be taken.)
- Funds available through the Learn More program to conduct the Community Sustainability Visioning process may also be accessed. Should the funds for this component be requested you would be expected to complete the Community Sustainability Visioning Report during the term of the agreement.

Pat:

After consideration of your e-mail proposal dated November 19, 2010, the following is Pinehouse's perspective. We commend the NWMO stepping up to the plate in realizing that we are being challenged(positive and negative) in and outside of the community. We agree that the NWMO must take a proactive stance – along with Pinehouse - under the Learn More program; we agree that engagement of the community (and region) takes various forms.

The attached excel spreadsheet identifies what meetings have occurred to date and where and with whom as it relates to the NWMO. Generally speaking, the rates is roughly 30% of the actual cost of the travel/meeting(s). It also identifies that Vince Natomagan (Pinehouse representative on NWMO/Co-ordinator) and Phillip Tinker (Elder) have played a leading role in continuous engagement of our local residents and people we "bump" into on our travels around the region. The financial figures is for 46 days (part-time) at \$30.00 per hour each for both Phillip Tinker (Elder) and Vince Natomagan (Pinehouse representative on NWMO/Co-ordinator). The total to be reimbursed to Pinehouse in the excel sheet is \$15,575.80.

Our leadership has decided that Vince Natomagan will be the lead contact for Pinehouse as it relates to the NWMO initial screening and subsequent phases/events. It is also strongly suggested that Phillip Tinker be designated Elder for the purposes of NWMO initial screening and subsequent phases/events. All inquiries from the community (and outside of the community) will be directed to Vince Natomagan and Phillip Tinker.

Vince Natomagan and Phillip Tinker have agreed to work together for the purposes of:

- engaging the community members
- travelling to neighbouring communities
- research and develop an Memorandum of Understanding
- conduct the Community Sustainability Visioning process and complete report
- co-ordinate relevant meetings in the community
- work in conjunction with the NWMO to hire a third party to review and evaluate NWMO material as it relates to the Adaptive Phase Management and siting process

Along with the above, a working group will be established consisting of 4 viable and respected community members to hold 4 dedicated meeting sessions to identify key components of the Community Sustainability Visioning report. Each session will be held on a weekend as to allow complete focus of the task at hand. The final report will be reviewed and ratified by the leadership of Pinehouse before it is released to the NWMO; but, the NWMO will have the option of continually assisting and being actively involved in the CSV report.

In addition, a community meeting will be held in the community to entertain and document any questions that members might have for the NWMO. Another meeting with the Junior Mayor & Council will be organized to discuss any concerns/views that the youth of Pinehouse might have. These meetings will include catering for the attendees.

Vince & Phillip will be available any time of the week to entertain any discussion that any community members wants to have whether its at the office, the street, the store, the local cafe or the home. Discussion will be held in the language that is desirable i.e. Cree or English.

Vince & Phillip will continue to promote, maintain & assist (community members) in viewing the NWMO display located at the Northern Village of Pinehouse offices. In addition, Vince & Phillip will promote, maintain and assist (community members) in the

portable NWMO stand that's to be located at the High School library. Vince & Phillip will also distribute any relevant NWMO material amongst the community.

Vince will keep all documentation including relevant financial information.

Financial proposal:

A) Engage community members (as per Learn More program)	\$20,000
B) Travel expenses to visit neighbouring communities	\$15,000

After consideration of your e-mail proposal dated November 19, 2010, the following is Pinehouse's perspective. We commend the NWMO stepping up to the plate in realizing that we are being challenged (positive and negative) in and outside of the community. We agree that the NWMO must take a proactive stance – along with Pinehouse – under the Learn More program; we agree that engagement of the community (and region) takes various forms.

The attached excel spreadsheet identifies what meetings have occurred to date and where and with whom as it relates to the NWMO. Generally speaking, the rates is roughly 30% of the actual cost of the travel/meeting(s). 



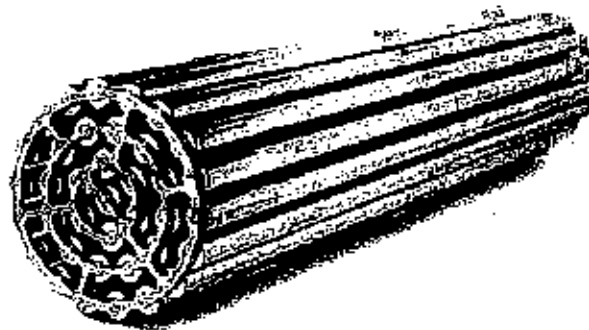

## **Purpose of the Learn More Program – Focus on Early Steps**

Interested individuals, organizations and communities may contact the Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) to learn more about Canada's plan for the long-term management of used nuclear fuel, the activities of the NWMO, and the process the NWMO will use to select an informed and willing community to host this project.

The NWMO's *Learn More Program* makes available resources (information and funding) to support participation in early steps of the siting process, as described in *Moving Forward Together: Process for Selecting a Site for Canada's Deep Geological Repository for Used Nuclear Fuel*. Other programs of support will be developed as the process unfolds.

## **Background**

The NWMO is responsible for implementing Canada's plan for the long-term care of used nuclear fuel produced by Canada's nuclear reactors. The plan is called Adaptive Phased Management, and it ensures that the generations that benefit from nuclear energy will have a plan in place for the responsible care of the used fuel arising from electricity production, ensuring long-term safety and security. Adaptive Phased Management is both a technical method and a management system. It is the approach that emerged following the NWMO's three-year national dialogue with citizens, specialists and Aboriginal peoples. It has as its end point the containment and isolation of used nuclear fuel in a deep geological repository constructed in a suitable rock formation. It was developed in dialogue with Canadians and chosen as Canada's approach for the long-term management of used nuclear fuel by the Government of Canada in June 2007.

The NWMO wishes to support the interest and involvement of Canadians in implementing Canada's approach for the long-term management of used nuclear fuel. Our current focus is on selecting an informed and willing community to host this important national project. This *Learn More Program* makes available resources on request (information and funding) and is designed to support participation in the early steps of the site selection process.

## Program Components

The five program components outlined below are offered as a set of resources that interested individuals, organizations and communities may find helpful in supporting their early consideration of Adaptive Phased Management, Canada's plan for the long-term management of used nuclear fuel.



### Learn More About Adaptive Phased Management

We encourage all interested individuals, organizations and communities to learn about how Adaptive Phased Management will safely and securely manage used nuclear fuel over the long term and the basis for confidence.

We invite interested individuals, organizations and communities to learn more about Canada's plan and the process that will guide selection of a safe site in an informed, willing community.

- » The Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) will meet with any group of individuals to provide information about Adaptive Phased Management and the nature of the project that the NWMO has been mandated to implement. The NWMO will provide funding to cover travel expenses for individuals representing organizations and geographically defined communities to meet with the NWMO at the NWMO offices in Toronto or other location as determined by the NWMO, consistent with the NWMO's participant expense guidelines.
- » A package of materials designed to help build awareness of the project and support small group conversations among interested citizens will be available on the NWMO website or will be mailed upon request.

Safety, security and protection of people and the environment is the overriding focus of the process that will lead to selection of the location for the deep geological repository for used nuclear fuel. For those interested in potentially considering hosting this project in their community, we suggest a good starting point is understanding the technical design and scientific site evaluation factors that will protect present and future generations and the environment.

Upon request, the NWMO will provide small amounts of funding to geographically defined communities to assist in the hiring of independent expert advice in order to help build their understanding of Adaptive Phased Management and the project that is planned. The NWMO will provide funding to assist a community to build its understanding of the technical safety dimensions of the project as follows:

- » Hire a third-party expert to review material published to date, in order to answer questions the community representatives may have about the safety of the project and the basis for confidence at this early stage.
- » The scope of the review may vary depending on the particular needs and interests of the community although is likely to include:
  - » Meeting with community representatives to learn their questions, which will direct the work.
  - » Review of a list of documents published by the NWMO, which describe Adaptive Phased Management and how safety is to be assured through the design of the facility and the nature of testing and safety demonstration that will take place through the siting and licensing process.
  - » Other materials as deemed appropriate by the contractor.
  - » Preparation of a brief report that describes the safety dimensions using language accessible to the broad public and that addresses the questions posed at this initial stage of work.

Proposals for projects to learn more about Adaptive Phased Management of \$15,000 or less will be considered. Proposals of larger value will be considered on an exception basis. In order to be qualified, third-party experts must be recognized as experts in their field, as demonstrated by teaching in a relevant area at a Canadian university and/or through working in an established Canadian consulting firm with a demonstrated track record in this area.

### **» Learn More About the Potential Suitability of the Community to Host the Project**

As outlined in *Moving Forward Together: Process for Selecting a Site for Canada's Deep Geological Repository for Used Nuclear Fuel*, at the request of a community, the NWMO will complete an initial screening of the geographic area (Step 2) against a short list of criteria. This preliminary assessment is designed to help a community understand, at a very early stage, whether they are likely to have a potentially suitable site(s). As a support to the community and at their request, the NWMO will provide funding to geographically defined communities, as represented by accountable authorities, to:

- Hire a third-party expert to review the NWMO's screening of the suitability of the community at this Step.

Proposals for independent expert advice at Step 2 of the siting process of \$15,000 or less will be considered. Proposals of larger value will be considered on an exception basis. In order to be qualified, third-party experts must be recognized as experts in their field, as demonstrated by teaching in a relevant area at a Canadian university and/or through working in an established Canadian consulting firm with a demonstrated track record in this area.

### **» Support for Visit to Interim Storage Facility Site**

The NWMO will cover travel expenses for a small representative delegation from a community to visit an interim waste storage facility in Ontario or other nearby facility, consistent with the NWMO's participant expense guidelines.

Should initial screening suggest the community has potential to be suitable for the project, the community – as represented by accountable authorities – may request and receive travel expenses to visit an interim storage facility.

Travel expenses to be covered at cost for a representative delegation of 3 to 5 individuals, including at least 2 municipal councillors (or similar accountable individuals).

### **» Support for Development and/or Refinement of a Long-Term Vision for Sustainability**

Early in the site selection process, communities may wish to consider this project in the context of their long-term interests. Such a broad approach would help highlight the resources (social, economic, environmental) of the community and pave the way for thinking about how the project may affect the community on a variety of dimensions.

Ultimately, the vision for the community and the extent to which the project contributes to this vision in an acceptable way is a matter for the community to discuss and assess.

Should initial screening suggest the community has potential to be suitable for the project, the community – as represented by accountable authorities – may request and receive resources to develop and/or augment an existing long-term vision for community sustainability.

Proposals for this work of \$40,000 or less will be considered. Proposals of larger value will be considered on an exception basis. The nature of resources provided is to be outlined in a memorandum of understanding between the community and the NWMO, with the community's use of funds subject to third-party audit upon completion.

### **» Support Activities to Build Awareness and Understanding of the Project Within the Community**

The NWMO will provide resources (information and funding) on request to support accountable authorities to engage citizens in the community to learn about the project and begin to explore interest in it.

Should initial screening suggest the community has potential to be suitable for the project, the community – as represented by accountable authorities – may request and receive resources to cover the costs of beginning to engage citizens in the community.

Proposals for this work of \$20,000 or less will be considered. Proposals of larger value will be considered on an exception basis. The nature of resources provided is to be outlined in a memorandum of understanding between the community and the NWMO, with the community's use of funds subject to third-party audit upon completion.

### **» Further Support**

This *Learn More Program* makes available resources and is designed to support participation in the early steps in the siting process. A program outlining support for participation in subsequent steps in the site selection process will be outlined as the process proceeds.

## Terms of Reference

### Introduction

The Nuclear Waste Management Organization (NWMO) is responsible for implementing Adaptive Phased Management, Canada's plan for the long-term care of the used nuclear fuel produced by Canada's nuclear reactors.   - Review some portion of each of the following documents: *Conceptual Design for a Deep Geologic Repository for Used Nuclear Fuel* (Background paper 6-9 prepared by CTECH); *Review of Conceptual Engineering Designs for used Nuclear fuel Management in Canada* (Background paper 6-1 prepared by ADH Technologies' Inc.); *Considerations in Developing a Safety Case for Spent Nuclear Fuel Management Facilities and Associated Infrastructure in Canada* (Background paper 3-4 prepared by Candesco Research); *Status of Geological Repositories for Used Nuclear Fuel* (Background paper 6-3 prepared by McCombie Consulting)
  - Review most recent NWMO Technical Research and Development Report: *Technical Program for Long-Term management of Canada's Used Nuclear Fuel – Annual Report* (Background paper TR 2010-01 prepared by NWMO)
- Other materials as deemed appropriate by contractor in consultation with community

### **Deliverables**

Preparation of a brief report that describes the safety dimensions using language accessible to the broad public and that addresses the questions posed by representatives of the community at this very initial stage of learning.

Key questions to be addressed include:

1. What is Adaptive Phased Management and what is the project which is planned?
2. What is the basis for confidence in the safety of key components of the plan, such as the deep geological repository with its multi-barrier system?
3. How does Adaptive Phased Management compare with approaches being used by other countries?

- For the purpose of this program, third party experts are defined as recognized experts in a related field, such as geosciences and engineering, as demonstrated by teaching in a relevant area at a Canadian university and/or through working in an established Canadian consulting firm with a demonstrated track record in this area.

- Hire a third-party expert to review material published to date, in order to answer questions the community representatives may have about the safety of the project and the basis for confidence at this early stage."




